<b>Emergency HEAP/PIPP Program</b>	Assist low income families who are facing an emergency situation and have a 10-day supply of heating fuel or less, or a heating utility shut-off notice. This program is operated in conjunction with the State of Ohio Heap Program. State of Ohio applications may be obtained through the JVCAI HEAP office. Also have summer cooling assistance program. <b>Community Services Program</b>	<b>Low-Income Household Water Assistance (LIHWAP)</b> is a federally funded program designed to help income-eligible Ohioans with their waste and wastewater bills. Eligible clients are those at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines(FPG), who have been disconnected (or have a disconnection notice), or either need to establish new service, or pay to transfer service. Clients with a current medical certificate protection expires. <b>Community Services Block Grant (CSBG), CSBG Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES).</b> Ohio's CSBG program receives funding from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services(HHS) to reduce poverty, build strong communities, and provide resources and services to support	740-384-3722

	<p>families in achieving self- sufficiency. Eligible clients are those who have been impacted by COVID-19 at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines(FPG), who have been disconnected (or have a disconnection notice), or either need to establish new service, or pay to transfer service. The services provided in this grant are a onetime only assistance of rental or utility assistance including water, electric, and gas.</p> <p><b>The Consolidated Appropriations Act 2021</b> also deals with COVID-19. Both of these programs help assist those impacted by Covid-19. Eligible clients are those who have been impacted by COVID-19 at or 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI), who have been disconnected (or have a disconnection notice), or either need to establish new service, or pay to transfer service. The grants include rental assistance, utility assistance –water, sewer, trash, gas, bulk fuel, and internet. The services provided in this grant are up to 12 months (including arrears and future payments) if funds are available, households may receive an additional 3 months, only if necessary to ensure housing stability. Households must reapply every 3 months for further assistance.</p>	
<p><b>Head Start (320 West South Street, Jackson)</b></p>	<p>This is a Federal program for preschool children from low-income families. <p><b>Healthy Pregnancy and Early Childhood Safety</b></p>	<p><b>Healthy Pregnancy</b> is for Medicaid-eligible pregnant women to help them to obtain resources within their community that are available to them. This program follows them throughout their entire pregnancy and postpartum period to ensure adequate pre/postnatal and pediatric care is obtained to produce a healthy baby and living environment.</p> <p><b>Early Childhood Safety</b> is in conjunction with Ohio Children’s Trust Fund which allows us to assist low-income Jackson and Vinton County residents. <p><b>Energy Program</b></p>	<p><b>Home Weatherization Assistance Program:</b> HWAP is a low-income residential energy efficiency program concerned primarily with building insulation and heating system retrofit measures. Eligibility is based on 200% of federal poverty income guidelines or other qualifying criteria. Services available include: attic, walls and floor insulation; primary air leakage reduction measures; heating system improvements; health and safety inspections and repairs. All measures are provided based on a state energy audit. Consumer Education is an established part of the program.</p> <p><b>Utility Programs</b> <b>WarmChoice®</b> is provided to Columbia Gas of Ohio residential customers who use natural gas as their primary heat source and are eligible for the Percentage of Income Payment Plan Plus (PIPP Plus) or have an income of 150% or less of federal poverty guidelines.</p> <p><b>American Electric Power - Community Assistance Program (CAP)</b> is provided to AEP residential customers needing to reduce their energy bills and improve their homes’ comfort. If you are currently enrolled in PIPP, or HEAP or have an income of 175% or less of federal poverty guidelines you could be eligible.</p> <p><b>The Housing Assistance Grant Program (HAGP)</b> provides emergency home repairs for homeowners at or below 50% AMI. This program addresses health and safety issues. Due to the high volume of need for this program, the funding is usually depleted within a few months of receiving it. <b>Emergency Healthcare Assistance</b>	This Program is offered for many uninsured and underinsured, low-income residents of Jackson and Vinton Counties, who are in crisis and in need of prescription medications, medical supplies, diagnostic testing, medical, dental and or optical treatment procedures, specialty consultations and/or transportation to medical/dental appointments. Individuals determined to be eligible for services may receive assistance for up to \$300.00 during the program year. We collaborate with many local pharmacies, medical supply vendors, transportation and medical/dental/optical providers, who have worked with our agency over the years and are willing to accept our vouchers and bill us for patient services. This program is provided through grants from CSBG and the J. Floyd Dixon Memorial Fund to help improve the quality of life for those we serve. <b>J. Floyd Dixon Grant:</b> We are pleased to announce the availability of emergency healthcare services for low-income, uninsured residents of Jackson County. This provides emergency medical, dental and vision needs UP TO a maximum amount of \$300. <b>Operation Warm:</b> Jackson-Vinton Community Action, Inc. in conjunction with the Governor's Office of Faith Based and Community Initiatives are providing free, new boys' and girls' coats.
